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MOSTLY MUTTS ANIMAL RESCUE CLOSES LOAN TO PURCHASE BUILDING, STARTS FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN FOR BUILD-OUT PROJECT

ACWORTH – Since November 1, 2013, when Mostly Mutts moved operations from its founder's property in Kennesaw, to the warehouse it currently occupies, the organization has worked towards the goal of owning the property. This milestone has now been reached as Mostly Mutts closed on the purchase on August 7, 2015, with financing from First Citizens Bank. *"Now the real work begins,"* said Tammy Turley, Executive Director. *"We have big plans for improvements inside and out, which will enable us to save more animals and provide them with even better care. We are counting on the community to help raise the funds needed to begin renovating."*

Mostly Mutts strives to reduce the number of animals euthanized at local shelters in Metro Atlanta by working with animal control officers to save adoptable dogs that are moments away from being put to sleep. Often, these dogs are sick, injured and require rehabilitation. Mostly Mutts provides housing, health care, training, and physical and emotional care to these rescued animals until they can be placed in a new "fur-ever home." **Since 2004, Mostly Mutts has saved approximately 5,000 dogs and cats.**

Mostly Mutts is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, licensed by the Dept. of Agriculture and staffed by volunteers. It is privately funded through donations and adoption fees.
